Our Mission



WORKFORCE & CAREER DEVELOPMENT

This program specializes in assessing and addressing barriers of individuals to increase their employability opportunities. We serve individuals who are unemployed, underemployed, seeking a career change, and previously or currently justice involved. This program helps strengthen the economic well-being of Oklahoma County's African American families and other families living in poverty by increasing sustainable employment that will lead to self-sufficiency and less dependent on government subsidies. We provide access to industry recognized certification, work readiness training, connections with employers with emphasis in high demand occupations.

EDUCATION & FAMILY DEVELOPMENT

This program specializes in supporting minority children to ensure success in school and development through achieving academic enrichment in subjects of science, literacy, technology, and math; social and personal skills development, and support to parents/caregivers by providing them tools to create environments and experiences that promote their child's academic success.

HOUSING & FINANCIAL LITERACY

This program provides information on financial skills (budgeting, credit counseling, and debt management) in order for our clients to improve financial and/or housing stability. We provide access to affordable housing through our rental properties and supportive services. Residents also receive financial coaching to develop money management skills in order to remain self-sufficient and independent. Offers affordable homes by rehabilitating existing structures and constructing new homes, and prepares families for homeownership by hosting home buyer essentials workshops and webinars.

SMALL BUSINESS

This program provides services such as start-up and expansion assistance to small businesses, minority owned businesses and those with disabilities. We provide networking and training and access to compete for corporate and government contracts and further resources to sustain your small business.

COMMUNITY CONVENING & SOCIAL JUSTICE

The Community Convening and Social Justice Department (CCSJ) works to close gaps related to social mobility and economic vitality for under-resourced communities. The department focuses on voter education and mobilization, criminal justice reform, police reform, economic development, and diversity and inclusion training. CCSJ hosts one of the largest Expungement Expos in the state helping clients gain access to better jobs and housing through the records expungement process.

Lisa "Lee" Evans

Making a Difference

Scholarship Award



The Urban League of Greater Oklahoma City will award the Lisa "Lee" Evans Memorial Scholarship in this fall to a broadcasting, strategic communications, public relations, or journalism major that is interning or will intern at the Urban League of Greater Oklahoma City. The recipient must show significant evidence of service to their community through community service and community involvement.

Lisa "Lee" Evans was a news anchorwoman for KFOR-TV (Channel 4) in Oklahoma City. She enrolled in the University of Oklahoma, graduating with a B.A. in journalism in 1991. While at OU, Lee was a great source of inspiration for other minority students and made a significant difference in their lives by her example of diligent work to achieve goals and dreams. She joined KFOR-TV in 1994, quickly earning a weekend anchor/reporter position through her prestige. Lee was the first reporter from KFOR to deliver news of the Oklahoma City bombing on April 19, 1995. She was a rising star in the field of journalism. Lee Evans will always be remembered as a bright, shining star with a bubbly personality, who set an example through her desire and drive to get ahead in life.



Award Criteria:



- Must be a broadcasting, strategic communication, public relations, or journalism major at an Oklahoma college or university.
- Must show significant evidence of service to their community through community involvement or community service activities.
- Must work a minimum of 210 hours at the Urban League of Greater Oklahoma City.
- While a specific GPA is not required to obtain the award, the scholarship committee would like to see evidence of a student's commitment to his/her education through GPA or ability to show progress from past semesters to the present
- Must be enrolled in a minimum of 6 hours in the semester for which you apply for the award. This may include an internship.
- Recipients will be required to write a thank you letter to the Evans family and attend the Urban League of Greater Oklahoma City's Annual Gala in June.

Janice Scott-Lee Employee of the Year

Dean is a passionate, mission-driven professional with nearly four decades of dedicated service to others. His distinguished career spans education, entrepreneurship, mentoring, and both community and personal empowerment.

A national merit scholar and graduate of the University of Oklahoma with a Bachelor of Arts degree, Dean was honored as the Most Outstanding Black Student by the OU Association of Black Personnel. His professional journey began at the University of Oklahoma, where he served as an academic counselor, mentor, and tutor for Project Threshold. It was there that he discovered his lifelong calling—to inspire, motivate, and uplift others.

For 17 years, Dean and Threshold were synonymous with student academic, career, community, and social responsibility. He effortlessly transitioned to the Eagle Ridge Institute, where he served for 16 years as Director of Education, Gang Intervention, Prevention, and Substance Abuse Programs. During this time, he developed expertise in community mapping, grant writing, risk and protective factors, strategic planning, volunteer recruitment and training, youth leadership, and resource development.

Currently, Dean serves as the Career Coach and Reentry Specialist for the ULOKC Workforce Development Program. His work focuses on breaking cycles of poverty and marginalization by delivering transformative job-readiness training, individualized career coaching, and comprehensive support services—particularly for individuals reentering society after incarceration, those experiencing homelessness, and the chronically under- or unemployed.
